The 96744 Code

The 96744 Code is designed to promote environments and activities free of alcohol, tobacco, and other drugs. Those adopting the 96744 Code agree to:

- Set positive examples for youth.



- Practice healthy lifestyles by implementing positive, healthy values such as the 5Rs (Respect, Responsibility, Resourcefulness, Relationships and Resiliency)
- Acknowledge that alcohol, tobacco and other drug use is inappropriate in public places such as parks, schools and athletic events.
- Educate people about the 96744 Code at community facilities and promote awareness of the consequences associated with non-adherence to the 96744 Code.

- Adopt the 96744 Code in your organization and family.
- Attend Community Works in 96744 monthly coalition meetings (check PACT KCFC's Family Center News calendar for dates, times and place).

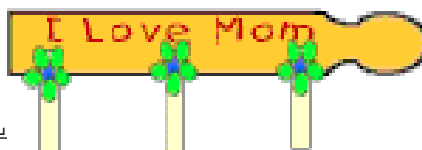

A Fun Mother's Day Gift to Make - Refrigerator Clip
Keep your refrigerator organized with this special gift for Mom, Grandma or Auntie!



CRAFT MATERIAL

- ◆ Paint stir stick (City Mill, Home Depot)
- ◆ Acrylic paint (your choice of color)
- ◆ 3 clothespins (with a spring)
- ◆ Wood or craft glue
- ◆ Magnetic strip or 3 strong magnets attached with a glue gun.
- ◆ Buttons, craft foam, decorations, permanent markers, optional

INSTRUCTIONS:

- ◆ Paint the stir stick with acrylic paints. then decorate the clothes pins with permanent markers or acrylic paints.
- ◆ When the paint is dry, glue the 3 clothespins onto the stir stick. Personalize the stick with pictures or "I love you".
- ◆ You can use fabric paint to add dimension. Let the fabric paint dry, about 24 hrs.
- ◆ Attach a magnetic strip to the back of the stick.
- ◆ You can also decorate the tip of the clothes pins by attaching items with craft glue, ie., flowers, buttons, craft foam, decorations, ribbons, pictures...
